


The Globally Harmonized System (GHS) requires specific elements to be included on hazardous chemical labels:

<p><b>Product J</b> (abc chemical)</p>  <p><b>Danger</b> Fatal if swallowed Causes skin irritation</p> <p><b>Precautions:</b> Wear protective gloves. Take off contaminated clothing and wash before reuse. Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product.</p> <p>Store locked up. Dispose of contents/containers in accordance with local regulations.</p> <p>IF ON SKIN: Rinse skin with water/shower. IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water. IF SWALLOWED: Immediately call a Poison Center or doctor/physician. Do not induce vomiting.</p> <p>ABC Chemical Co., 123 Anywhere St., (123) 456-7890 See the SDS for more information</p>	<p><b>Product Identifier:</b> the name or number used for a hazardous chemical.</p>
	<p><b>Pictogram:</b> one of 9 icons used in the Globally Harmonized System to indicate hazards.</p>
	<p><b>Signal Word:</b> indicates how severe a hazard is and alerts the reader to potential hazards.</p>
	<p><b>Hazard Statement:</b> describes the nature of the hazards, including severity.</p>
	<p><b>Precautionary Statements:</b> describe measures to minimize or prevent effects from exposure to the chemical, improper handling or storage.</p>
<p><b>Supplier Information:</b> name, address and telephone number of the manufacturer, importer or other responsible parties.</p>
